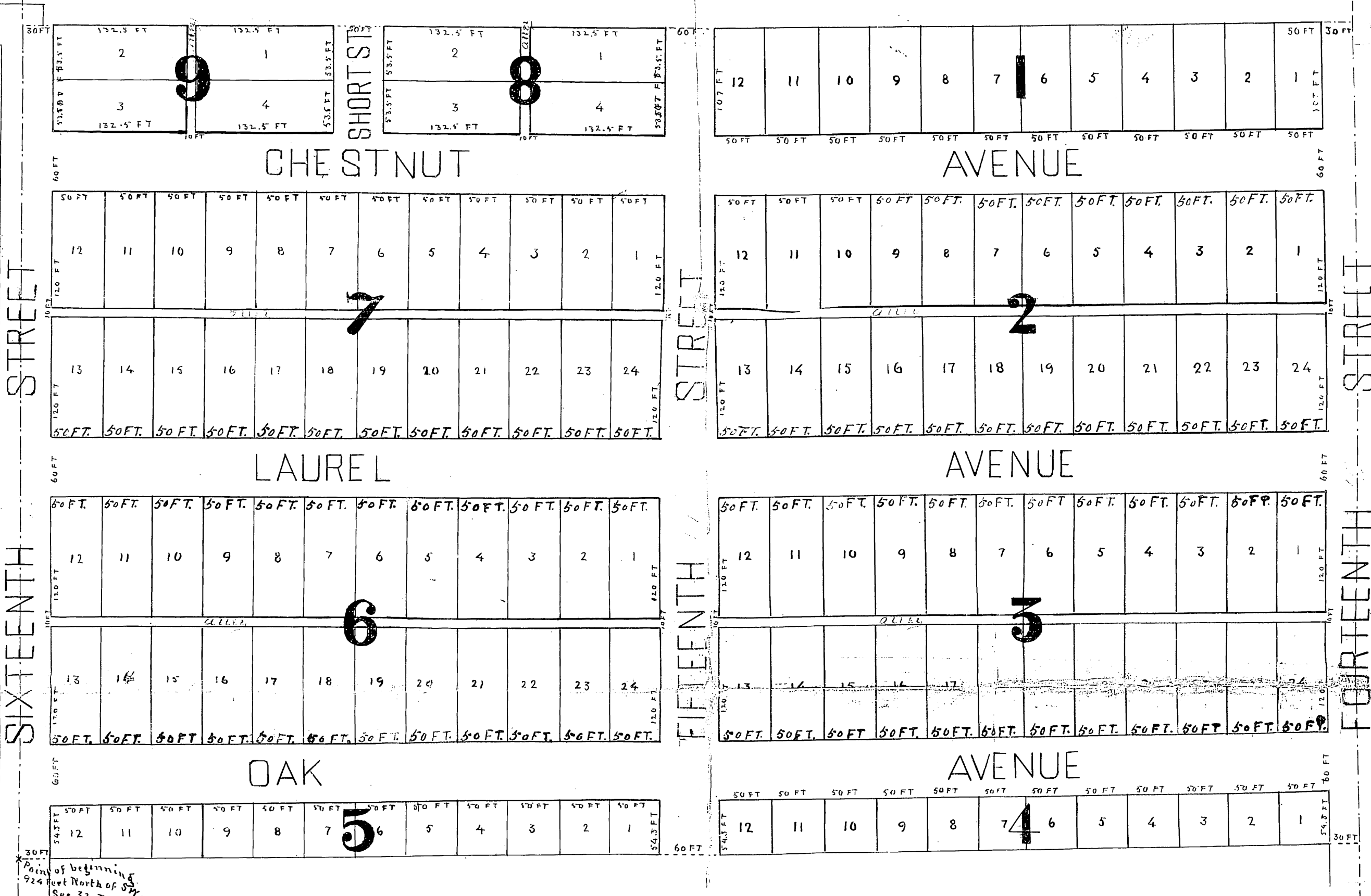


BARNES

This plat and subdivision of land is named, Barnes Addition to Western Highlands, and covers the lands in Wyandotte County, in the State of Kansas, which are bounded and described as follows, to wit: commencing Fifty-three (53) poles south of the center of Section number thirty-two (32) Township number Ten (10) Range number Twenty-five (25); thence, number thirty-two (32) Township, number Ten (10) Range, number Twenty-five (25); thence, South Fifty (50) East, Eighty-one (81) poles; thence, South one (1) pole; thence, West one (1) pole; thence, South Fifty (50) poles; thence, West Eighty (80) poles; thence, North Fifty-one (51) poles, to the place of beginning; containing Twenty-five and ⁵⁰/₁₀₀ acres, more or less.

The parcels of said lands reserved for sale are described by numbers as Blocks and Lots in Barnes Addition to Western Highlands; the Blocks being numbered and designated by large black figures, and the Lots, by small black figures. The parcels of said lands reserved for public use are Streets, Avenues, and Alleys; and the names, extent, and direction of all such streets, Avenues, and Alleys are designated on this plat, and are hereby reserved for public purposes, as such. All said Lots reserved and intended for sale are set forth and described by numbers in the Blocks; and the precise length and width of each Lot in feet and decimal parts thereof is set forth in this plat in small red figures.
