

DESCRIPTION

This plat of CLINTON PLACE No. 2 comprises land in Wyandotte County, Kansas described as follows:

Beginning at a point 40 feet south and 247.5 feet east of the N.W. corner of the N.E. 1/4 of Section 30, T. 11 S. R. 25 E. Thence south 460 feet; to the north line of Clinton Place; thence east 272 feet to the west line of Lots 1 to 6 inclusive of Block 1 of said Clinton Place; thence north along the west line of said lots 145 feet; to the northwest corner of Lot No. 1; thence east 120 feet to the west line of Fortieth Street; thence north along the west line of Fortieth Street 315 feet to the south line of Metropolitan Avenue; thence west 389.8 feet to the point of beginning, excepting two parcels, each 50 by 120 feet, belonging to C.Y. Allison and the heirs of Arthur Blankenship, and numbered 5 and 6 on the above plat.
