DESCRIPTION

This Plat of "GRANDVIEW ORCHARD" covers land in WYANDOTTE COUNTY, KANSAS, described as follows, to-wit:-

Beginning at the Northwest corner of the south west one quarter of Section 8; Township 11 S; Range 25 E; Thence EAST four hundred thirty-nine (439) feet; Thence South fifteen hundred eighty-two (1582) feet; Thence west ten hundred forty-four and one half (1044½) feet; Thence north seven hundred forty-one and six tenths (741.6) feet; Thence East three hundred sixty-three (363) feet; Thence north eight hundred forty and four tenths (840.4) feet; Thence East two hundred forty-two (242) feet to point of beginning.

DEDICATION

The lands reserved for sale are shown upon the accompanying Plat as Lots in BLOCKS; and are designated by numbers, the Blocks being numbered with larger red figures, and the Lots with small black figures; The location and exact size of each and every Lot, and the extent and direction of all Avenues and Alleys are shown on the accompanying Plat and reference is made thereto.
